What data do we collect?

Clondulane National School collects the following data:

- Personal Identification Information (you name and email address, if you provide it postal address and a phone number) when you send us an enquiry by email, phone or post.
- Your browsing activity for analysis to make our site more functional and relevant to our users.

How do we collect your data?

You directly provide Clondulane National School with most of the data we collect. We collect and process your data, on a consent basis, when you:

- Enrol in the school
- Are a service provider whom we pay for a service
- Voluntarily complete a survey or provide feedback on any of our electronic mediums
- Use or view our website via your browser's cookies

How will we use your data?

Clondulane National School collects your data so that we can:

- Provide you with requested information e.g. enrolment forms or answer queries on same
- Provide you with information relevant to the school environment: school closures, school activities, calendar information etc.
- Provide you with information we feel is important e.g. cyber safety information, school policies etc.

How do we store your data?

Clondulane National School securely stores your data on encrypted hard disks.

Clondulane National School will keep your data for the length of time required to provide you with the service you requested from us and the duration legally required by the Department of Education and Skills.

Marketing

Clondulane National School does not contact you for any marketing purposes.

We occasionally send you information about school related information or notices that we think you might like if you have agreed to receive email, you may always opt out at any stage.

You have the right at any time to stop Ballintotas National School from contacting you for purely information purposes.

What are your Data Protection rights?

Clondulane National School would like to make sure you are fully aware of all of your data protection rights. Every user is entitled to the following:

The right to access – you have the right to request of Clondulane National School copies of your personal data. We may charge a small fee for this service.

The right to rectification – you have the right to request that Clondulane National School correct any information you believe is inaccurate. You also have the right to request Clondulane National School to complete information you believe is incomplete.

The right to erasure – you have the right to request that Clondulane National School erase your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to restrict processing – you have the right to request that Clondulane National School restrict the processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to object to processing – you have the right to object to Clondulane National School processing your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to data portability – you have the right to request that Clondulane National School transfer the data that we have collected to another organisation, or directly to you, under certain conditions.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that may be stored on your computer, or mobile device, to collect standard Internet log information and visitor behaviour information. When you visit our website, we may collect information from you automatically through cookies or similar technology.

How are cookies used?

Cookies are used to improve your experience on our website including:

- Remember technical changes or selections you may make between pages, language preference etc.
- Understanding how you use our website.

What type of cookies do we use?

There are a number of different types of cookies, however, our website uses:

Functional cookies: we use these cookies so that we recognise you on our website and remember your previously selected preferences. These could include what language you prefer and location you are in.

Advertising cookies: we use these cookies to collection information about your visit to our website, the content you viewed, the links you followed and information about your browser, device and IP address.

We use session cookies which are erased when you close your browser or after 5 minutes of inactivity. Any other cookies are set to erase within 30 days. We do not use any persistent cookies.

How to manage your cookies

You can set your browser not to accept cookies (the above website tells you how to remove cookies from your browser). However, in some cases some of our website features may not function as a result.

Should you decide to change your preferences later through your browsing session, you can click on the “Privacy & Cookie Policy” tab on your screen. This will display the consent notice again enabling you to change your preferences or withdraw your consent entirely.

As a rule, cookies will make your browsing experience better. If you do prefer to disable cookies on this site and on others. The most effective way to do this is to disable cookies in your browser.
